

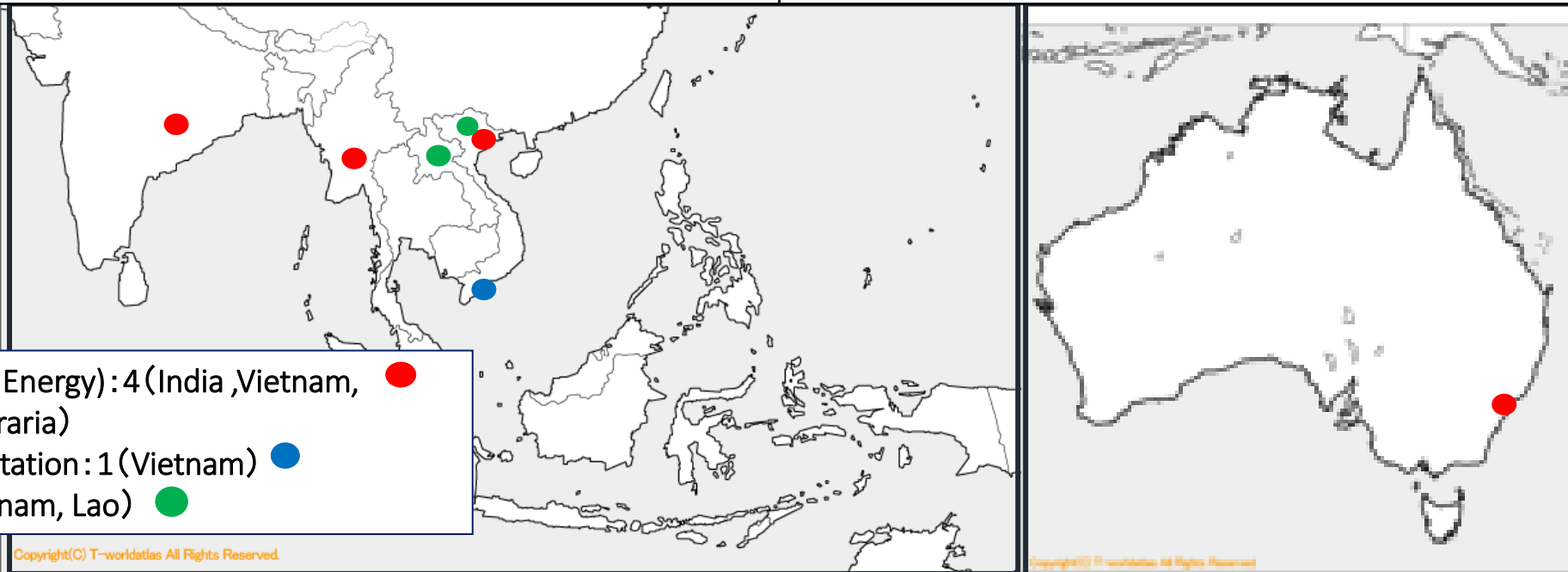
# About JWRF

  - Capacity development of engineers of local governments in developing countries.

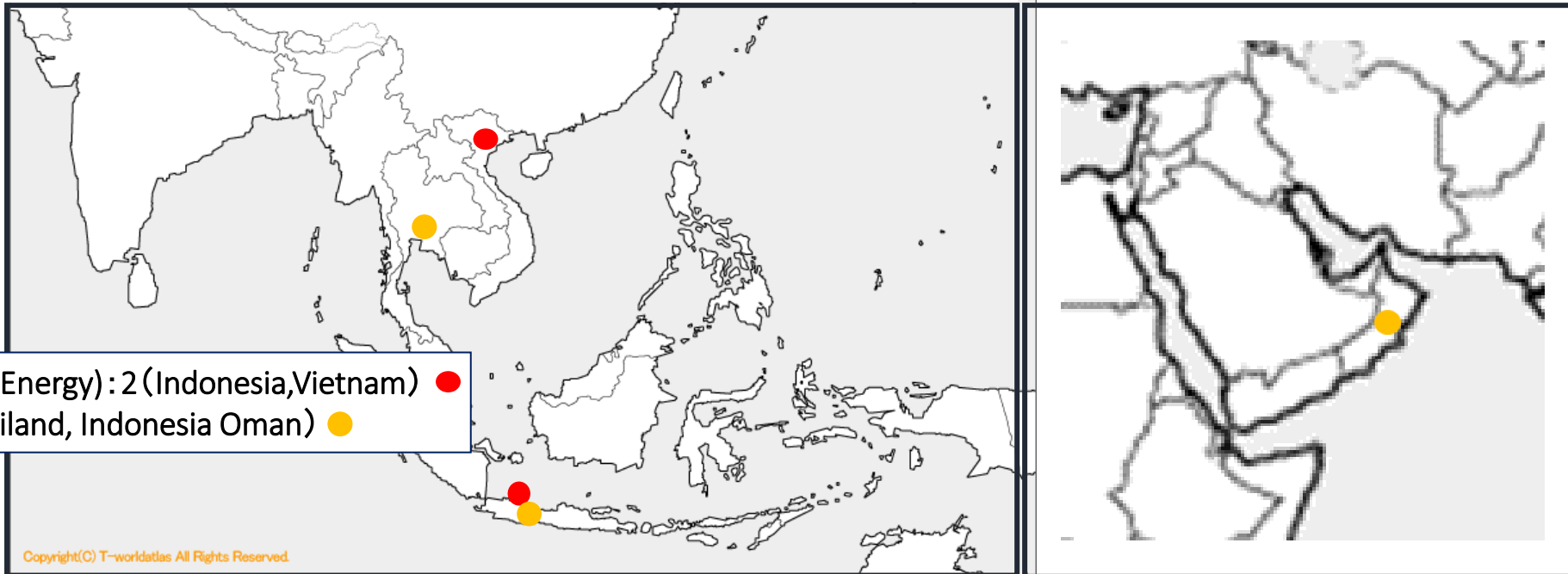
